### Frequently Asked Questions

#### 1. What sort of activities will be offered?

Our staff cater the activities to the abilities and wishes of the campers, we cannot guarantee these specific activities every weekend, but usually they are a few of: parachute games, a pontoon ride, kickball, tag games, scavenger hunt, and hiking.

#### 2. Where will my child be staying?

The campers will be staying in one of our village cabins. Each cabin has a bathroom complete with a shower and sink area. Beds are twin sized.

#### 3. If my child has a friend coming along, will they get to stay with them?

When you register your child there should be an option to put down cabin mates, make sure to put your camper's friends down under that and we will make sure they will be together!

#### 4. Will there be pony rides this year?

Whenever possible we offer pony rides sometime during the weekend. Unfortunately, sometimes the weather changes our Wranglers' schedules for other events, and leaves them unavailable to give pony rides.

#### 5. What happens if my child gets homesick?

Homesickness is common among campers, especially those that are younger and are not used to staying away from home. Our staff is trained to work with children who are homesick, and work with campers to help them enjoy their time at camp! Please do NOT tell your campers that they can call home, studies done by the American Camping Association and the Christian Camp and Conference Association have shown that this increases homesickness and increases the child's odds of needing to be sent home.
